The most beautiful women in the world? Bella Hadid and Beyoncé

Followed by Amber Heard, Ariana Grande and Taylor Swift. Don't you agree? Contact the surgeon Julian De Silva who conducted a study applying the aesthetic canons of Ancient Greece to some of the most beautiful women in the world

In a world of **body positivism** and **diversity**, to say "defect" is an offense, to say "perfection" is a heresy. The study of the medical surgeon **Julien De Silva** is not finding much sympathy, who, thanks to a personal research, has established who **the most beautiful women in the world are**.

Result? **Bella Hadid** in first place, silver for **Beyoncé**. To bring to this singular classification the application of the aesthetic canons of **Ancient Greece** to a special *hi-tech* program that has calculated which face leads to a number as close as possible to **perfection**.

A computerized mapping program with which De Silva "**analyzed**" **the physiognomy of some of the most famous faces in the world**: actresses, models and pop stars were his champions.
